GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Gospel is Matthew's account of the Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. John recognizes Jesus as the Messiah, the greater One than himself. John tries to have Jesus baptize him instead of John baptizing Jesus. Jesus' relationship with fullness of the GODhead is evident. A voice speaks from the heaven: "This is my beloved Son. My favor rests on Him." The Holy Spirit appears as a dove. The fullness of the Trinity is evident. Jesus is manifested as the Son of GOD, the Anointed One (Messiah – Christ). This is truly a turning point in the life of Jesus. He transitions from the role of carpenter to the ministry of service and proclaimer of the GOoD News. We are reminded as we recall our own Baptism, that like Jesus, we are being sent out on a mission of proclaiming the GOoD News of the GOD's love for others. This is our calling and our mission. We must make known to others the message of Jesus and the salvation He brought us through His death and resurrection. We, as sons and daughters of GOD, must share the Gospel with others by "doing GOoD" and allowing them to experience the grace that comes in and through Jesus.
