R: A scoffer who is rebuked will only hate you; the wise, when rebuked, will love you.



MT 18:15-20

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory be to You, Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples: "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two brothers along with you, so that 'every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If he refuses to listen to them, tell the church. If he refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector.

Amen, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. Again, amen, I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks to His disciples on the need to be in harmony with their fellow believers and to honestly, lovingly, and affirmatively encourage those who are out of sync with the Gospel command of love and challenge them to get back inline. Jesus' words today give a step by step process to follow with those with whom one is in contention: 1) personal, one-to-one, encounter; 2) small group of the faithful, 3) the whole church. The purpose should always be to help the one who is erring to come back to the full union with the body of believers. Jesus ends this passage with a request that the whole activity be done in prayer and recognition of His presence with the community of believers.

As I reflect on the readings I realize the need for me to be in touch with the LORD GOD in my own life. It is when I am aware of my own sinfulness and shortcomings that I can be more attentive to GOD speaking in my life. I have to take responsibility for my own failures. As I am progressing along the road to the LORD, then I must reach out to those who have also taken some wrong paths along the journey. I must treat them with the same compassion and mercy that I have experienced from GOD for my own transgressions. I am never to act self-righteously, with a "better-than-thou" or "holier than thou" attitude. That is not loving others the way I have been loved by the Abba-Father and the Lord Jesus in union with Holy Spirit of love.
