R: Give thanks to the Lord, acclaim His Name; among the nations make known His deeds, proclaim how exalted is His Name.

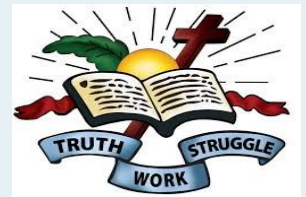
C: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

READING 2

A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Phillipians.

Brothers and Sisters:

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death — even death on a cross!

Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

GOSPEL

MT 1:18-25

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory be to You, Lord.

This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, “Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.”

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: “The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel” (which means “God with us”). When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

As we continue our celebration of Christmas, we once again recall what we are celebrating: The Word of GOD – Jesus – has taken on our flesh and pitched His tent among us (thus sharing all of our experiences – except sin). This Divine Word not only has given us human life, but has come to reveal to us how we are called to be His adopted sisters and brothers as we are offered the inheritance of the adopted daughters and sons of GOD our Abba-Father.

Without Jesus – GOD the Son – being born a human, we would never be able to fully share in the divine life which is made available to us. Let us continue to praise and thank GOD for this gift of GOD, not only during this Christmas season, but always.
