

GOSPEL

MT 5:20-22, 27-28, 33-34, 37

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory be to You, Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples:

“I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.

“You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. But I say to you, whoever is angry with brother will be liable to judgment.

“You have heard that it was said, You shall not commit adultery. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

“Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow. But I say to you, do not swear at all. Let your ‘Yes’ mean ‘Yes,’ and your ‘No’ mean ‘No.’ Anything more is from the evil one.”

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Living a life of a disciple of Jesus, the Master-Teacher, is challenging. Jesus asks us to do more than just keep the commands and the law. Our First Reading is from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and speaks of the importance of knowing and keeping the commandments. Psalm 119 (of which we only have a few verses of this longest of the psalms) also declares the value of seeking to do what GOD requires of us in order to experience blessings from GOD. Although not chosen to go along with the other readings, the Second Reading proclaims the awesomeness of GOD's wisdom, which had been revealed in the past to the Hebrew people but is now being revealed to all who are open to the movement of the Spirit. In the Gospel, Jesus emphatically announces that He has not come to do away with the Law and the Prophets (Hebrew Scriptures) but to bring them to fulfillment and raise the bar even higher.
